MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." So begins the third chapter of Ecclesiastes, the first eight verses of which testify to the reality of change. But even in the midst of change we need to remember one thing; "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8) There is at least one thing we can be sure of in life, change will happen whether we want it to or not. People change, perspectives change, institutions change, our world changes, and the universe itself is always in motion – it never stops changing. We may not like change. It disrupts our comfort zones. It challenges our perspectives. It can be uncomfortable, difficult, and sometimes painful. Yet I also believe change is important for our emotional and spiritual growth and can become an invitation to take another step toward spiritual and emotional maturity.

I believe it's important to understand change as a way that God moves us forward toward a more complete understanding of Godself. As the founder of Methodism, John Wesley, stated, in this life "we are going on to perfection". The implication here is that we are not there yet, we are not perfect yet – especially in our understanding of God. Our lives are filled with opportunities to refine and adjust our understanding of who God is and who we are in relation to God; to move toward a more perfect relationship with God. Many of those opportunities are introduced through change. We need to understand that change is always an invitation to grow. We can treat change as a threat and try to avoid or prevent it, but in doing so we may be refusing an invitation to grow.

As we adjust to change in our lives we grow. I can think of a number of changes in my life that were bad, or at least I thought so at the time. But those changes often made me a stronger person, a better person, and broadened my perspective in life. When I was just entering my teen years I did not want to move to Maryland and leave my comfortable and familiar life in upstate New York. But I realize now that my life there was relatively sheltered in comparison to the life I was introduced to when we moved to Bowie. The change helped me grow in ways I would not have had I remained in New York. When I was in middle school I was uprooted from the school where all my friends were to a new school inside the D.C. beltway as part of an effort to desegregate schools. That was a frightening and uncomfortable change, but it broadened my perspective yet again. I became aware of what it was to be a minority and came to understand how terrible and false racial stereotypes can be. My world and my perspective became much more inclusive.

I believe that God invites, or allows, change to happen in our lives because it is through change that we grow – ultimately closer to God. Maintaining the status quo rarely provides the fertile soil we need to grow. The bottom line here is this; whether we like it or not change will happen, and when it does it's an invitation for us to grow both emotionally and spiritually. We need to be willing to grow in response to the changes that come our way.

Why all this talk about change? I bring it up because change is going to happen in the United Methodist Church. It's going to happen this month when the special session of the General Conference makes decisions concerning the United Methodist church's stance on the issue of homosexuality, the ordination of gays and lesbians, and the legitimacy of performing same sex unions. I don't have a clue what that change will look like though I do have

suspicions. What I do know is that the church will look different. Whatever the change is I will view it, not as a threat, but as an opportunity to change and to grow.

Will this change the way we do things here at Mount Carmel United Methodist Church? Probably not a lot. There is one other thing we can be sure of in life, the mission of the church does not change. The way we do ministry, the contexts within which we do ministry, the situations our ministries will address will change, but our mission will remain the same. Here at Mount Carmel we will still be "The presence of God in community, loving, guiding, and healing." The work of our church will remain the same, reaching out in Christ-like love to the people around us and connecting them to God through ministries of love, acceptance, and compassion. As far as I know the mission of the United Methodist Church won't be changing either. It will still be "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." No matter what is decided later this month we still have the work of Christ to do. One friend reminded me the other day that the Church is of Christ and so no matter what happens the church will remain.

Through the month of February I encourage you to be in prayer for the United Methodist Church and our witness to the world. Pray that we may continue to set the example for Christ-like love lived out in ministries of love, acceptance, and compassion.

Realm is HERE!

Realm is our new church management and administration software. An overdue update to our old Church Helpmate program, Realm is a web-based product with numerous improvements to how we can manage our social, administrative, and financial activities. Now rather than a program quietly running in the church office, "in the cloud" we all have access to better keep up with all the goings-on of church life.

How will this affect you? As little or as much as you like! Seamlessly providing all the functionality of the old software, everything will be managed in the background as before. BUT, because it is a web based application, you will have the ability to log on and manage your own profile, check on your giving, organize committees and activities, and so much more. We're just starting to get into all the features it provides...

On-line giving <u>will</u> change. As it is a built in function with Realm, so there is no need for a 3^{rd} party company to provide service. Also text giving will be an option, with the ability to donate on the go to a whole list of funds.

More Realm news will be coming as we explore and implement the features of the program. We are updating Realm to include your email information so we can send you an invite to join. We have sent 112 invites this past week. If you have not received an invite, please let the office know by calling Betsy at 410-255-8887.
