## **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

As February drew to a close the special session of General Conference of the United Methodist Church voted to adopt what is called the Traditional plan as Church Law thus prohibiting members of the LGBTQ community from serving as ordained ministers. The adopted plan also prohibits United Methodist clergy from recognizing, solemnizing, or conducting same sex unions or marriages. There were some amendments in the legislation which may or may not be prohibited by the United Methodist constitution. These will need review from the Judicial Council. If found unconstitutional those amendments cannot go forward and will not be included in the Discipline.

So you may ask where does this leave us? Good question. Most of us are still trying to figure that out. We will have a better idea after the Judicial Council rules on the constitutionality of some of the provisions in the plan that was adopted. As far as I can tell we are pretty much where we were before all this started. Some of the prohibitive language in the discipline will be tightened and clarified. Otherwise little will change from the way we have already been dealing with the issue. The 2016 Discipline is still in force with the prohibitions concerning homosexuality that have been in the Discipline since 1972. The plan that was voted on will, pending Judicial Council Review, go into effect in January of 2020.

There is the possibility that some churches who are not in agreement with the direction the church is taking will be allowed what is called a gracious exit from the denomination – but that is one of the amendments that may not pass judicial council review. Even if it does pass review the bar is rather high and the reason for exit must clearly be the unwillingness of the entire congregation to live under the specific conditions of the traditional plan.

What the ruling does NOT do is ban members of the LGBTQ community from becoming members of the United Methodist Church, attending its programs and worship services, serving on committees, or assuming positions of leadership in the church – other than those positions that must be served by clergy. The United Methodist Discipline continues to affirm members of the LGBTQ community as people of sacred worth and of equal worth with every other human being. This may seem for many to be hypocritical – and they would be right, it is. As Bishop Eastering, our conferences episcopal leader has reminded us, we are an imperfect church filled with imperfect and hypocritical people for we all are hypocritical in some way. We must acknowledge and confess this failing and ask God for forgiveness. No one is perfect, the church least of all.

We need to be aware and repentant of the fact that as a denomination we have wounded members with this decision who are a growing part of the population. With this decision we have disenfranchised a number of people in the church – including young people who may not themselves identify as LGBTQ but who support their friends who are. This can't be good for the church especially in a time when church membership is declining. Unfortunately no matter what the outcome with this decision some group was going to be hurt and disenfranchised.

So we have some healing to do, we have some bridges to rebuild, and I believe we must ask God's forgiveness for the pain this decision is causing and the discrimination which is being allowed to exist in a denomination that has historically fought discrimination in all its forms. Those of us who are disheartened and disappointed need to remain faithful, patient and, most importantly, engaged in the conversations surrounding this issue. We also need to remember to never put a period where God has put a comma. God isn't finished with us yet. This

issue is by no means settled. Those who are joyous and exultant over this decision need to understand that God is NOT joyous or exultant over those decisions that cause another human being pain and anguish. That such decisions are made in the first place – or even considered - is a sign of our brokenness and imperfection. We need to take heart that God is about the work of perfecting us through the love of Jesus Christ. We need to be patient as God continues to do this perfecting work.

What can we do now? We can pray for unity within the church even in the face of differences. We can pray for and with those who have been hurt and disaffected from the church asking that God grant them comfort, peace, and hope. We can let them know they are of sacred worth. We can continue the discussion concerning homosexuality in the church and continue to move that discussion forward. We can be patient with the church and with one another realizing that God is not finished with any of us yet. As it is the season of Lent we can turn to God acknowledging and repenting those ways in which we have participated in or allowed the existence of discrimination of all kinds in our world – including discrimination against the LGBTQ community.

We need to remember that the mission of the church has not changed in any way and important work remains to be done. We continue to be called to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We continue to be the presence of Christ in community; loving, guiding, and healing. There are millions who are unaware of God's love in Jesus Christ so we need to continue spreading the Word. There are many suffering under injustice, who live without hope, who face despair each day – we are called to continue being the hands and feet of Christ for them. There is a lot of work to be done. Be patient, be faithful, keep calm and carry on. One day we shall overcome!
