

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Have you ever had doubts before embarking on a trip? Journeys can be perilous undertakings. They take us out of our comfort zones. Certainly they broaden our horizons but they can also increase our risks. Myself, I tend to be a worrier. I worry about what could happen when I'm on a journey. I worry about the car breaking down, I worry about having an accident, I worry about what might happen back home while I'm away. If I'm flying I worry about getting through the TSA lines in time to make the flight, I worry about just getting through the TSA line without anything going wrong (I'm not sure what could go wrong – but I'm a great believer in Murphy's Law). I worry about making connections, losing luggage, and getting lost. I actually did get lost at Logan Airport.

Usually I find that all these doubts and worries are groundless. When the journey is over I'm always glad I ignored that urge I had not to go. Having taken the journey I find myself refreshed, renewed, inspired, and in some ways subtly changed. It was always worth the trip – in spite of the worries I entertained while getting ready to embark.

We will find it was worth the trip.

I invite everyone who is a member, friend, or constituent of our congregation to enter into a time of prayer before we set out and as we engage in the process. With God's guidance and supported on your prayers we will discover the exciting future that awaits the people called Mount Carmel United Methodist Church.
