

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"Once the arrow has left the bow there's nothing you can do to change its course, so aim carefully." That's the sage and superfluous advice that was given me when I was taking archery lessons. Imagine – you have to aim <u>before</u> firing – who would have thought! As important and obvious as this advice seems for someone who is using weapons; it is much less obvious, but just as important advice for anyone who wants to succeed in life. In order to achieve our goals we need to aim well and aim carefully otherwise we may miss the mark or fall short of where we want to be. So a very good question, that we need to ask ourselves each day, is – "what am I aiming for? What is my trajectory of my life?"

When I was working in the High School setting this was advice that I, and many other teachers, were trying to give the students. We were continually encouraging them to consider the consequences of some of their decisions. They had to make some important decisions about where they wanted to go in life and understand that some of the decisions they were making at the moment would affect the trajectory of the rest of their life. Decisions about whether or not to get involved with drugs, or gangs, would set the trajectory of the rest of their lives. The decisions that landed them in the AP office, (assistant principal's office) would have an effect on future education, future employment, and future success. By the same token decisions to study, or get involved in student government, or to get tutoring would also have an effect on their future. So they needed to ask themselves, what was their trajectory? Where did they want to go? How would they aim their lives? It really does matter where we aim because once the arrow has left the bow there are times, regrettably, we can do nothing to change its trajectory.

Fortunately you and I are not inanimate objects like arrows. For us redemption is possible and grace is available. True, sometimes we can't take back the mistakes we've made; we can only resolve not to make them again. Sometimes the trajectories we set for our lives have hurt others and brought us to places of regret and sorrow. But in recognizing our mistakes we can seek forgiveness and aim higher. The saying goes, "today is the first day of the rest of our lives". To me this means that with each new day we have the opportunity to improve our aim, and adjust the trajectory of our lives.

As Christians we believe in a God of second chances, and third chances, and fourths, and fifth chances, and so on. God has demonstrated over and over again His grace and his forgiveness. And each new day God holds before us the vision and promise of his Kingdom and encourages us to aim our lives towards its glory, to try again, to aim higher, to aim better, and to carefully set the trajectory of our lives toward His kingdom.

So I ask each of you reading this to begin each day asking yourself these questions: Where am I aiming today? Do I have my sights on the kingdom of God? What can I do today to set my trajectory toward the kingdom?

And to those of you reading this who are graduating from high school and college I encourage you to keep aiming high. You have come this far by aiming well and aiming high. Trust in God and set your sights on His kingdom. Do all you can each day to set the trajectory of your life on that bright goal and you will find yourself soaring each day in the joy and company of God's Spirit.
