MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

As of this writing we've completed two strategic planning workshops. We've taken a close look at our congregation's current situation in respect to our ministries, our finances, and the level of congregational engagement we are experiencing. We have assessed the resources that are available to us and identified major issues that need to be acknowledged as we begin planning. In our second session we took a look at the overall health of denominations and religious organizations in America as well as the health of United Methodist congregations here in the Pasadena area. We examined trends in church membership, attendance, and financial health. It's been a sobering yet encouraging experience.

Our congregation is doing O.K. Not as good as we could be doing but better than a lot of other congregations. We have some issues to deal with relating to worship times, styles, and opportunities. We, along with the other United Methodist Churches in our area, can be described as a "greying" church. This is reflected in our low Sunday school attendance – a characteristic we share with neighboring United Methodist congregations. We are a homogenous group (meaning that there is not much diversity in our congregation). We are an insular group (meaning we love being together but it may be difficult for us to include outsiders or new people and they may not feel comfortable coming here.) We seem to be in the same boat with many other churches in our area in that our financial giving is not quite meeting our financial need even though our budget is essentially a "bare bones" budget.

We have some wonderful strengths going for us. We do traditional worship very well and this is enhanced by having an exceptional choir. We don't seem to be afraid to try new things – like the praise service that we are now doing once a month – September through May. We are very active in outreach and missions through the soup kitchen, Sarah's house, CAMP HOPE, Holiday Sharing, and other programs. We tend towards informality in our worship gatherings which adds to our friendly atmosphere.

As we move forward I anticipate that our strategic plan will build on our strengths and attempt to strengthen some of our weaknesses. Our next meeting will be on July 9th at 7 p.m. At that time we will be identifying some relevant opportunities for ministry that we may be able to take advantage of and talk about ways of "road testing those opportunities". This will be an exciting meeting because we will begin to plan ways of moving forward and growing our church.

One way of doing this is by identifying specific groups or cohorts of people that we could be serving but aren't – either because they may not feel welcome here or because we are not providing ministries relevant to their needs – and seeking to invite and include them in our life together. We began identifying some of these groups at our last meeting. Some of those identified included single parents, developmentally disabled people and their families, physically disabled people and their families, and members of the LGBTQ community. These people live all around us but may not feel welcome, don't feel that we meet their needs, or feel that they don't fit in. Our homework for the July 9th meeting is to think of other cohorts or groups that we could be serving but aren't and come to the meeting with those suggestions.

We live in a challenging time for the Christian faith in general and for our own congregation in particular. Yet it is also an exciting time during which we may be able to chart new paths for the church and for our congregation's ministry. Please be in prayer for us as we continue our strategic conversations. I also invite you to be a part of the discussion, the planning, and the dreaming by participating in the workshops yourselves. We have several left. Upcoming Strategic planning workshops will meet on July 9th, August 7th, September 9th, and October 7th. All the workshops are scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. and adjourn at 9 p.m.
