

## **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

Something that is kind of hard for us to imagine these days is communication without email, print, radio, TV, and all the different forms of electronic messaging that are available to us. It is amazing to think that the Christian Faith spread so quickly and so far without the use of any media at all. The only media available to Christians was word of mouth - a face to face, person to person exchange of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Yes, there were documents – but they were not available to the "rank and file" members of the Christian movement. Many people didn't know how to read. Making copies of documents was a painstaking and arduous task and perhaps prone to inaccuracy. The epistles of Paul and others were the first to be circulated but they were read to a gathering of Christians – no one had a private copy. The Gospels were also hand written and painstakingly copied but, again, no one had private copies. In fact things did not improve until the mid-15<sup>th</sup> century when Johannes Gutenberg invented the printing press.

So how and why did the Good News of Jesus Christ spread so far and so rapidly? People shared what they knew of the story of Jesus – but most importantly they shared with one another <u>their own experience and relationship with</u> <u>Jesus</u>. They used their own words, they communicated their own emotions and their own feelings. They didn't share a history, they shared their-story. There was no printed curriculum to be had. The only curriculum that existed lived in a Christian's heart. When that was shared it was moving and compelling. So in those one on one, face to face, sharing's of faith and the experience of Christ - the Church grew – one person at a time, one story at a time.

Over time however, and after the invention of the printing press and all the successive improvements to media, the sharing of faith has become much more informational and less transformational. In that change I believe the Christian movement has lost something precious and vital – the personal touch. If the movement is to flourish into the future it won't be through the sharing of "approved" information or doctrines, but by the sharing of our individual stories in informal one on one conversations with those who are seeking a relationship with God through Christ.

That may sound like a daunting task and, for those of us who may feel a little inhibited, downright scary. But it's really not all that hard. Think about it. You are reading this as a member of the Christian Community called Mount Carmel United Methodist Church. You found your way to the church probably because you were compelled by the example or the story of someone else. Maybe it was your mom or dad or a grandparent. Perhaps it was a close friend or a co-worker. Your decision to join the Christian movement did not happen in a vacuum. Someone somehow moved you. They probably didn't prepare a formal speech or lesson but simply demonstrated Christian living and simply shared with you their beliefs that sustained them, and the story of how God moved in their lives.

The churchy word for this is witnessing. Witnessing sounds scary but it's really just about telling your story. In that telling of your story you may be sharing with another person something that will transform their life, bringing them joy, hope, assurance, and an abiding comfort. If that other person is a close friend or relation, isn't that something you want to share with them; that you need to share with the? Believe me – if what you tell them comes from the heart – it won't be awkward. It will be transformational and you will have given them the greatest gift you could ever give.

You don't need to know all the right words. You don't need to know all the fancy theological concepts. You don't need to be able to quote chapter and verse of scripture. All you need to do is share what your relationship with Jesus has done for you. That's how the church began. That's how the Christian movement was sustained for 14 centuries! I'm sure it will work just as well now and sustain us into the future. I encourage you to be a part of the movement. Share YOUR story! Give your friends the greatest gift you have to give! The gift of faith in a loving, eternal, and saving God.
