MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

As I write this letter to you it isn't even Thanksgiving yet but what I really need is Christmas. We celebrated All Saints Day only a couple of weeks ago and already I'm yearning for Christmas. If it were up to me I'd be putting our Christmas tree up and decorating my home right now. I desperately need the Christmas Spirit overwhelming me. In fact I think many others are right there with me. I need to hear the angels declaring, "Peace on Earth and good will to all people." We need peace! We need good will! We need it and yearn for it right now because we have so little of it.

It also seems we are filled with fear; the fear of change and loss. It lies underneath all the negativity that seems to be a part of our world right now. I need to hear angels declaring, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in city of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Christ, the Lord."

We are a nation torn apart by political/ideological differences. Good Christian people are making judgments about other good Christian people based, not on that person's faith but, on that person's political affiliations and ideologies. It seems that people these days are less apt to be immersing themselves in God's message of hope and salvation and more focused on political messages of anger and division. We seem to be more afraid of what we think will be taken away from us than we are hopeful and joyful in what has been given to us; namely an assurance salvation and new life where the destructiveness we experience here no longer has any power.

What we need is good will for and between all people. We need to be reminded that as Christians, fear and anger, judgement and division, are not a part of our narrative. Our narrative, our story, is a message of hope, love, forgiveness, joy and peace, born into the world on Christmas day. We must never forget that. We must always celebrate it. We must always communicate it in the face of all the negativity that is out there in the world right now.

If we lose sight of our story which began long ago in Bethlehem, then we really will be lost. If we allow the negative rhetoric that we are hearing on every side drown out the voice of Jesus in our hearts then the victory promised in Jesus will not be ours. I have no doubt that God's narrative of love, peace, and hope will be victorious but if we let the anger of this world drive it out of our hearts we will be in deep spiritual trouble. So you see a lot is at stake here. Our very souls are at stake here. The soul of our nation is at stake here.

It is up to us, those of us who truly claim Jesus as our Lord, to be the angels of our age declaring to the world the good news of Jesus' birth. We have a message of hope, love, joy and peace, which can drive the negativity and anger from our world. May the song of the angels, the message of the angels, be our song and our message! God has acted decisively in our world to save us from the soul crushing power of hate, fear and the anger they produce. God has stooped down into our world so that we may know first-hand that our God is a God of hope, love, forgiveness, compassion, and peace! I encourage each of you reading this message to focus on these things. I encourage you to tune out the negative rhetoric that seems to be all around us and replace it with the message of the angels. Proclaim it in all you say and all you do. Because everyone needs Christmas right now and every single day of the year. This is our message:

"Do not be afraid! We bring you good news of great joy for all people, a savior has been born to you, he is Christ the Lord."

Carmel CDC since school started in September. We have had many fundraisers this year so far and I would like to thank everyone who has supported us. The **Rumor Meal** fundraiser earned us \$101.55, **Ledo's** earned us \$195.57, and the **31 Totes** earned us \$228.00. The money collected will be placed in our fundraising account and will be used for new items around the center. We have already purchased a couple of new shelving units/book cases for our classrooms which the teachers were very excited about. The swings on the playset will be replaced with colorful, rust proof seats and chains. We are very excited for all of these items we can now purchase. Our **Book Fair** was one of our biggest fundraisers, we exceeded last year's amount which was \$3,500.00 to \$3,600.00 this year, Wow! We were able to earn \$1,700.00 in the scholastic catalog, allowing each class the ability to shop for their classroom.

Thanksgiving preschool celebrations will be held on November 25th, and 26th, with many different activities and special snacks in each of the class rooms. Preschool will be closed on November 27th, 28th, and 29th, and the center will be closed early on the 27th at 2:00pm, and closed all day on the 28th and 29th.
