It is already time for Outreach to roll out projects for the holiday season. We are doing things a little differently this year. We do not need to prepare the Thanksgiving Fixing bags for our friends at the soup kitchen this year. Those items are being provided by the Food Bank. However, with the cost of groceries, more people are coming to the soup kitchen for help. The shelves are as empty as I've seen them. For the months of November and December our food collection will benefit the Pasadena Soup Kitchen with shelf-stable items that stretch a meal like pasta, mac & cheese, rice and instant mash potatoes. We are completely out of those items. The Child Development Center will be helping us with this project. Regular size items are needed, not the super-sized items found in the big-box stores. For Christmas we will be receiving names from the county for the Holiday Sharing program. We have requested the names of 5 small families and 5 seniors in our area. We will be asking members and friends to help by providing help with the cost of a Christmas meal and presents for the children. This is the program we have been helping for many years. An Encouraging Word

"For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." - **Ephesians 6:12**

Feeling that you are powerless is a terrifying feeling. Occasionally I have had a dream, a nightmare really, of being swept away in a fast-moving river, unable to swim against the current, being tossed about in rapids, and being swept toward waterfalls. Perhaps it's my subconscious telling me that I'm feeling out of control in some facet of my life. I really don't need my subconscious reminding me of that – it's not helping! The feeling of not being in control and of being powerless is a horrible feeling. Yet it is a feeling experienced by many every day.

The thing is I'm not really powerless! It's true that I don't have very much political power, and I don't have a tremendous amount of financial power, or political power leveraged by financial power, but I really don't need any of those. I have something better. I have spiritual power and spiritual power is a power that transcends any other kind of power that we can imagine or aspire to. When the world falls away, as it will for each one of us, political power will disappear. When the world falls away economic power and all it represents will disappear as well. Spiritual power will endure because spiritual power comes from God.

We experience spiritual power everyday in the love of others for us and our love for others. We see spiritual power in acts of kindness and compassion. We know spiritual power in the loving grace with which God forgives us, loves us, and holds us. We engage spiritual power through prayer, in acts of charity and love, and through bearing witness to the love of God. As we engage spiritual power, we transform the world in ways that political or economic power never can. So, you see, any of us who love and serve God, and seek to love others as God loved us, are powerless.

The shame is that there are so many in our world who are feeling powerless in the face of political and economic power. I believe these feelings of powerlessness are the source of most of the turmoil and anger in our world. It is out of economic and political imbalances that anger toward economic and political systems is fomented and grows into systems of hatred and intolerance. It is paradoxical that many of those who are being driven by feelings of economic and political powerlessness - and resulting words and acts of anger - would also profess a faith in the one who grants them the greatest power of all - spiritual power. If they truly understood the power God invites them to claim, they would be free of the fear of powerlessness.

Claim the spiritual power that is offered us by God through faith in Jesus Christ. With it we can remain strong even as we are challenged by feelings of worldly powerlessness. With it we can transform the world with the powerful love of God and bring hope to those who are being tossed on the tides of fleeting worldly power.
