An Encouraging Word

I've always loved the springtime. Where I lived as a child in New York the wintertime was a bit restrictive. Sure, there was plenty of snow to play in, but our outdoor activity was limited by the cold, extremely short days, and often just plain lousy weather. With the warming of spring and the lengthening of days our world expanded, and we were free to explore the lush fields and greening woods surrounding our home. As my brother, sister and I explored we were surrounded by signs of returning life everywhere. It was in the fragrance of the air, evident in the budding leaves on the trees, the birdsong, and an explosion of insects appearing everywhere. We were surrounded by the great mystery of life emerging from death. The returning spring presented us with seemingly limitless possibilities for play and exploration. The springtime has lost none of its wonder and mystery for me. It still presents the amazing possibilities of renewed life, victorious over the seeming death of winter. It is here, in the midst of returning warmth, awakening nature, the lengthening of days, and the

triumph of new life in our natural world that we celebrate the mystery of resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus that we celebrate presents possibilities that surpass our human limitations, the restrictions placed upon us by death's cold reality. Freed from the restrictions of death our world expands to the limitless possibilities and horizons of life without end.

Death has always presented an impenetrable barrier to human possibility. No matter the beauty of our days, the joy of our lives, or the glory of our accomplishments, death has always appeared as the

exclamation point marking our end. Jesus' death and resurrection removed the exclamation point and replaced it with a comma. Life and unimaginable possibility continue beyond the end of physical death. In this endless spring we are free to live joyfully - no longer hemmed in by the restrictions of human mortality. We are free to contemplate the endless possibility and wonder presented in life beyond death with the same joy and excitement of children released from winter's prison to explore the mystery of renewing life all around them.

My prayer for all of you is that you have a happy and joyful Easter, that you enjoy the returning warmth of Spring days, that you have the opportunity to explore and appreciate the wonders of new life exploding all around us, and that the liberating joy of resurrection and life everlasting overwhelm your hearts and set you free.
