It is time for the Outreach Annual Autumn Food Drive to benefit the Pasadena Food Pantry (formerly the Soup Kitchen). We are starting a little early this year due to the very empty shelves at the Pantry. The Food Bank is doing a good job of supplying frozen meat and some staples but not enough to fill one bag. The Pantry must purchase or depend on donations for the rest.

There have been approximately 100 families served each month since June at this location. One of the new families explained that they started coming to the pantry because during the Covid Pandemic their family received \$250 per month in food stamps. Federal funding has been cut and they are now receiving \$25 per month to feed their family. It doesn't matter how you feel about food stamps, you can't feed a family on \$25.

We will be asking for certain items each month through November so you can help stock the shelves. For the remainder of **September we are asking for pasta products and canned soups**. You can bring your donations to church and place them in the box in the narthex. Please keep in mind that the Seventh Day Adventist do not eat nor distribute pork products when choosing soups. The Outreach Committee thanks you for your help with this local mission

An Encouraging Word

In our Zoom bible study, we've been learning about Simon Peter and of how Jesus invited Simon to take his boat out into deep water to catch fish. This was a request which Simon reluctantly accepted. He was tired, the fishing had been unsuccessful, and he had just cleaned and put away his nets. Yet he did accept and was rewarded with the largest catch of fish he had ever had. He would go on to the super difficult job of fishing for men.

Ministry in Jesus' name is difficult. It can be frustrating, exhausting, and sometimes scary. Yet Jesus asks it of us every day; to go out into the deep water and engage in the work of fishing for people. That is what we are called to do: "to go make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world". (The mission statement of the United Methodist Church). It's deep-water work and sometimes it can seem beyond our capabilities. Sometimes we can be overwhelmed by the work that is before us. Sometimes it may seem intimidating and completely outside our comfort zones. Yet Jesus calls us to the task and when we lean into the task with faith, we'll find the work affirming and rewarding. We'll discover that we have the capacity within us to do amazing things in Jesus name.

Philippians 4:13 declares, "I can do all this through him who gives me strength." Christian ministry is an act of faith. Engaging in ministry is an act of faith. Whether it be chairing a committee that is responsible for directing ministries or being engaged directly in those ministries accepting Jesus' call to go out into the deep-water work of ministry is an act of faith - believing that Jesus will supply whatever strength we need.

One of my favorite bible stories when I was a child was the one about David and Goliath. The story takes up an entire chapter – 1 Samuel 17. You probably remember the story. Goliath was the mightiest of the Philistine warriors. He would continually go out onto the field of battle and challenge

Saul's army to send out a man to champion Israel and fight him man to man. Yet no man felt up to the challenge of meeting Goliath in single combat. Goliath seemed to be beyond formidable. He is described as being 6 cubits in height (approximately 9 feet tall). He was armed with impressive weaponry and was undefeated on the field of battle, a truly daunting and terrifying foe.

David was the youngest of Jesse's sons. While his oldest brothers joined Saul's army David remained at home watching the sheep. He was barely a teenager! One day Jesse sent David to the encampment of Saul's army with supplies. While there David heard Goliath's challenge bellowed across the battlefield and was dismayed that no one would accept the challenge. David declared that he would accept the challenge. Saul protested saying that David was a mere youth and not up to the challenge, but David responded, "The Lord who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine."

We all know the rest of the story. David met Goliath's challenge and killed Goliath with a well-aimed stone let loose from a sling. I'm sure that Goliath looked just as frightening and formidable to David as he looked to everyone else in Saul's army. Yet David had faith in God that gave him the confidence to take up what seemed a truly daunting task. Armed with that faith David went into the deep water of serving the Lord and was victorious. David would go on to be the greatest king that Israel ever had and the ancestor of our Lord Jesus.

We don't have to meet the challenges we face in life alone. Whether they be the challenges of accepting Jesus' call to make disciples in deep-water ministry, or any of the other formidable trials we face in life, we don't face them alone. Accept the challenge trusting in God to supply your need. Know that God is with you as you face those challenges and with God's support you will be successful.
