Encouraging Word from Pastor Mike

"Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God." ~ Corrie Ten Boom

Trust is fundamental to life. Without trust in someone or something, a constant in a world of chaos, life would be intolerable. Life would become a continual and endless battle against paranoia and looming disaster. We all need constants in our lives that we can trust if we are to live well and victoriously. We need a steady rock to serve as the foundation for our lives.

I have Meniere's disease which, happily, is in remission right now. But a few years ago, when it was active, it was a nightmare. I won't get into all the technical aspects of the disease, but the result is that the signals from my vestibular system, my inner ear, to my brain get scrambled. When I have episodes caused by the disease I no longer know where up or down is, what I can see visually doesn't make any sense. I would experience extreme vertigo. My episodes would last up to two hours. All I can do is lay down on the ground, something I know is not moving or shifting, or even vibrating. I have to keep my eyes shut and hold on for dear life. My savior in these moments is solid level ground, something I know wouldn't shift or change under me.

For many of us it's family, friends, and close relationships that provide the solid foundation we can trust when things seem to be falling apart. For some of us it could be our work. Yet even these, as excellent as they are, may prove for some to be fleeting. Relationships change, jobs end, people are fallible, and they are mortal.

Psalm 31: 3 - 5 and 14 - 15 declares that the one in whom we can place our trust is God and God alone.

You are indeed my rock and my fortress; for your name's sake lead me and guide me; take me out of the net that is hidden for me, for you are my refuge.

Into your hand I commit my spirit; you have redeemed me, O Lord, faithful God.

But I trust in you, O Lord;
I say, "You are my God."
My times are in your hand;
deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors.

In case you haven't noticed, there is a lot of fear abroad in the world right now, and fear unaddressed, uncomforted, and un-attended to turns to anger which simply generates more fear, like an insidious vicious circle. Much of that fear comes from a lack of trust. There is an absence of trust in the world, trust in something or someone to grasp onto and hold onto when our fears assail us.

As Jesus' people we have an antidote to the seeming absence of things that can be trusted. Jesus! Jesus himself encourages us in John 14:1 "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me." We no longer have to succumb to the paranoia and looming catastrophe that often is so

much a part of this ever shifting and uncertain world. We can face the confusion and fear trusting in Jesus – the living and very solid stone upon which we can steady our lives.
