### **Encouraging Word from Pastor Mike**

Walter Mitty is the main character from James Thurber's short story, "The Secret Life of Walter Mitty." In the original short story, which by the way is very different from the two movies the story inspired, Walter daydreams a series of heroic daydreams where he imagines himself as a heroic pilot, a gifted surgeon, a deadly assassin and heroically facing a firing squad. He daydreams about himself doing amazing and heroic things – which of course never happen.

The character has inspired the creation of a word which has entered the official lexicon of the English language. The word, mittyesque, is defined in the American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language, as an ineffectual person who spends more time in heroic daydreams than paying attention

to the real world. A secondary definition is: someone who intentionally attempts to mislead or convince others that he is something he is not.

In Acts 1: 9 - 11 we find the disciples, who have just witnessed Jesus lift off into heaven, still standing around with their heads in the clouds. Perhaps they were daydreaming about heaven – who knows. Whatever it was they were doing they were not paying attention to the real world around them. Instead, they were focused on the Kingdom where they may have been imagining further adventures with their Lord. They had to be called back to earth by two heavenly beings who essentially said: "What are you guys doing with your heads in the clouds? Don't worry about Jesus – he will reappear just as mysteriously as he did the first time."

In other words, "You need to focus on the work he commissioned you to do and get your heads out of the clouds. Stop daydreaming about being in heaven with Jesus! Do heavens work here in this world, Jesus will be with you, and you'll shine with Heaven's light in this world."

How do you imagine yourselves being received into heaven? Heroically? With acclamations of the great crowd of witnesses that have gone before? Well, it's OK to daydream about that wonderful day. But in the meantime, what goes for the disciples also goes for us. We need to get our heads out of the clouds and not just dream about the kingdom – we need to do the Kingdom work in the here and now. We need to not just think about doing heroic things in the name of Jesus – we actually need to be doing them.

Being a Christian isn't about the sweet by and by. It is about doing God's will on earth in the here and now. Dreaming of heaven is fine. But if that's all we are doing, if the dream doesn't move us to work toward the Kingdom through practical ministry in the here and now, then aren't we being a little like Walter Mitty?

Walter dreamed of being a hero – but never was. Christ invites us to be real heroes in our world and enables us through the Spirit to be so. We don't have to dream about it – we get to make it so! So, let's do what the angels suggest – get our heads out of the clouds and get to work making the Kingdom real in our present-day reality.
