### **An Encouraging Word**

You have probably heard the adage that when God closes a door God opens a window. Well, my belief is that when God closes one door God opens another DOOR! Sometimes several. Some folks may be satisfied with the window, but I prefer to look for and expect a door. Especially when a ministry is the door that closes.

Over the last month our congregation has encountered several major changes, neither of which we were expecting. First, at the beginning of the month we received Shannon and Joe's resignation. Then at the end of the month came the regrettable but necessary closing of the Child Development Center. Ministries have seasons and those particular seasons have closed for us. The thing with seasons is that they keep coming! Spring always gives way to Summer, Summer to Autumn, Autumn to Winter, and Winter to Spring. It may seem that our ministry is facing a winter season. But we all need to remember that new life, growth, and opportunities arrive following Winter with the Spring. I have confidence that this will be the case for us as well.

Sometimes we invest a lot of time and effort in a particular ministry, but a time comes when God says no and redirects us. Such an instance happened to the apostle Paul. You can read about it in Acts 16: 6 – 16. This is the account of Paul's Macedonian call. Paul wanted very much to revisit and strengthen the churches he had started in the Asian province of Galatia during his first missionary journey. He also wanted to take the Gospel to unchurched areas beyond that region. He was traveling with Silas and Timothy, and they all wanted to head directly west. At least that was the plan, and they were on their way when God said no. "They had come to the border of Mysia and they tried to enter Bithynia but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to. They were directed to Troas instead."

They had their plans and were very much invested in them, but God had a different idea and redirected them on a different journey. In this new journey they would meet Lydia. Lydia would be Paul's first Christian convert in Europe. She invited the three missionaries into her home where she and her entire household were baptized. She was a woman of great influence and helped extend the Christian gospel, one of the first missionaries into Europe. Here we see God definitely closing one door for Paul, Silas, and Timothy and opening an entirely different one.

This was certainly not the first time that God redirected a well-intentioned ministry, nor would it be God's last. The narrative serves to remind us that often we have well intentioned ideas of where we want a ministry to go and of how we want things to turn out and then God intervenes and says no. God has another plan in mind. I believe that is what is happening in our ministry at Mount Carmel. We need to enter into a season of prayer and discernment as together we begin to follow God on a new path, seeking new opportunities for ministry. The ministry of the Child Development Center has served its purpose and served well. Now it's season has come to an end. But a new season is beginning and with God's help we look to the future to discern what that future ministry may be. Joe and Shannon served God well while they were with us and led us along a wonderful and inspiring journey of music ministry. Now that season has come to an end and a new season is beginning. With God's help we will look to the future to discern new directions in music and worship ministry.

I invite everyone reading this to join in this discernment process through prayer and discussion. There will be opportunities this Fall to join in the conversation as we seek the new doors through which God will lead us.
