An Encouraging Word

We all live a distracted life. There are distractions everywhere! It's really hard to get away from them. We are distracted by T.V. and online news. We are distracted by social media, smartphones, text messages and notifications, phone calls, talk radio, and that pesky noisy air-conditioning unit. The list of possible distractions is exhausting. I turn on my computer and connect to the internet to get my email and am greeted with the Microsoft start home page which is filled with titillating headlines all engineered to distract me. (They know my search history and what's going to lure me into the bottomless pit of useless information.) Have you ever searched Wikipedia for specific information only to find yourself drawn into the wiki-hole where you spend hours chasing interesting blue lined texts? Distraction! It's the way of modern life.

What would it be like to simply be alone with God, or with your thoughts, with nothing to distract? Personally, I think it would be really scary. I had a friend who once checked himself into a monastery for several weeks in order to finish a writing project. He could use his computer but there was no internet. There were no T.V.s or radios. Smart phones were not allowed. In fact, there was only one phone in the entire monastery and that was for emergencies only. There was a strict unvarying prayer routine: morning prayer, mid-day prayer, evening prayer, and finally vespers. Silence was the norm though discussion was allowed at the noon and evening meals. For the rest of the time, it was reading and writing which was the goal of his stay. He went there to write without distraction. He told me later he nearly went nuts! It's a scary thing being alone with your thoughts and God.

Yet it is when we are alone with our thoughts and God that we can truly come to know ourselves. It's in those times without distraction that we have the opportunity to think clearly. Jesus instructs us in Matthew 6:6," But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you." Away from distractions we are rewarded with an intimacy with God we can find no other way. We are told in Matthew 14:23 that after dealing with the crowds Jesus "went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone." Throughout his ministry Jesus would deliberately seek isolation away from distractions in order to be closer to God and to perhaps order his own thoughts. The less distracted we are the clearer our paths will be.

So now I'm going on a short sabbatical, a time away from the distractions and pressures of ministry. Will I be able to avoid all distractions? Probably not. But hopefully I'll be able to clear enough of the weeds away to get a better idea of the direction I need to be taking as I guide this congregation through another year. Perhaps I'll come away from this with a clearer understanding of the direction God wants me to take in my own life from this point on. Will I return to you like Moses coming down from the mountain armed with the secrets of the universe? I really don't think so. But I do hope to return with a clearer understanding of where God is calling me and of how to meet the swiftly changing needs of this congregation. There will be times when I will be alone with my own thoughts and with God, more time than I am normally able to devote to it. That's a little scary, but it's also exciting. I simply ask for your prayers now as I take time to be alone with my thoughts and with God.

This will be the last encouraging word you will be getting from me for a while. Expect the next one around September11th. The news and announcements portion of the Encouraging Word will continue to be sent weekly.
