An Encouraging Word From Pastor Mike

Several weeks ago, my brother and I had the opportunity to drive past the old family home in Watertown N.Y. It's the home where my grandmother and great-uncle grew up. It's the home where my mom spent her childhood before they moved to Syracuse. It was home for my great-uncle Laurence until he passed away in 1976. It was where I lived with my mom, dad, and little brother for six months when I was four years old. I have many wonderful memories of that place. It's a grand old Victorian house and I remember that it was filled with many high-ceilinged rooms each of which provided great adventure for little boys. I remember the long dark and mysterious stairways to the upper floors and cavernous attic where I was allowed to play on rainy days accompanied by the whisper of rain on the roof. I also remember the basement and especially the coal bin where I was NOT allowed to play – but did anyway. I remember it being a happy place that was always filled with love and joy.

When my brother and I drove by several weeks ago we were crushed by what had become of that beautiful home. It's located on Winslow Street which is the eastern extension of Paddock Street. As we drove along Paddock Street, we were impressed with all the grand Victorian homes that line it, all of them immaculate and stately. But then Paddock Street became Winslow Street, and the neighborhood changed dramatically. Many of the houses lining that street are also Victorian but very careworn. Many empty and broken windows were evident. There was an abundance of missing siding, collapsed

porches, and trash and junk scattered across un-mowed lawns. Our old house seemed to have fared a little better – but not much. The once grand porch was sagging, and risers to the steps were missing. The paint was peeling and the stately elms that once stood in front were gone – reduced to stumps. It was evident that the house was occupied but hopelessness radiated from every window. What a difference one block makes!

I realize that outward appearances often have little bearing on what's going on inside, but I also know that the homes we live in often do reflect the personalities of those who occupy them. The homes on Paddock Street reflected pride and joy, the ones on Winslow Street reflected just the opposite, hopelessness and despair.

As I thought about this experience and the outward appearance of dwelling places and how those appearances may reflect what's going on inside, the words of Paul, recorded in 1st Corinthians, came to mind. "Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" – 1 Corinthians 3: 16. "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own." 1 Corinthians 6:19. Much like the outward appearances of those homes on Paddock and Winslow Streets reflect the joy or despair of those who dwell within them, so our outward appearance reflects the hope and joy of the presence of God's Spirit within us or its absence. As we present ourselves to the world around us, what does the world see as it drives by? Does it see the hope and joy that reflects the presence of God's spirit? Or does it see a life filled with fear, and despair? We need to do some self-examination and ask ourselves; do our lives reflect the presence of the Holy Spirit dwelling within us. Or have we allowed our fears, our prejudices, and our discontent to drive the Spirit away leaving only the shell of what was once, or could still be, a grand edifice?

I encourage you to fill yourselves with the things of God's Spirit. I encourage you to seek ways of reflecting the Holy Spirit within you so that when others see you, a dwelling of the Holy Spirit, they may see and know hope and joyful expectation. I encourage you to follow the instruction of Paul found in Philippians 4:8, "And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise." In doing so we will fashion ourselves into a lovely and stately dwelling reflecting the presence of the Holy Spirit.
