An Encouraging Word from Pastor Mike

"Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will stand."

Over the last few months, I've been trying to plan for the future. I've been trying to make decisions based on what I think will happen in the future. For example; one question I have to answer as I start looking at retirement requires me to figure out how long I need my retirement to last so that my money will last until I (and/or my wife Leslie) won't need it any more. How will I take my payout or disbursements from my 403b retirement plan? That doesn't seem like that hard a question until you realize that what's really being asked is: When do I plan to die? Yikes! Name me one person who nailed the answer to that question. Another question concerns what kind of Medicare plan do I think I'll need? Some plans work better with people with certain medical conditions than others. So, what kinds of medical conditions do I plan on having . . . 20 years from now? Tell me this isn't a government operation!

Of course I have other decisions I need to make as well, many of them based on an unknowable future. Sure, I can try to make educated guesses to increase my odds of making the right decisions. But we all know the adage about the "best laid plans of mice and men . . .". That phrase originated from a poem by the Scottish poet Robert Burns entitled "To A Mouse". "The best laid schemes o' mice an' men. Gang aft a-gley." Which translated becomes "The best laid plans of mice and men can often go astray." No matter what our plans are, and no matter how carefully we lay them, they can go wrong. Nothing is sure. Then of course there is the wonderful adage concerning the perversity of the Universe which states, "anything that can go wrong will go wrong" otherwise known as Murphy's Law. How in the world do you plan for that?

I guess the only sure thing about the future is that there will be taxes. We all know this adage: the only sure thing is death and taxes. Well Jesus took care of the certainty of death so all that leaves is taxes. The corollary to this of course is that the other sure thing about the future is that there won't be any death. (Of course, I could try to answer my life expectancy question regarding my pension by saying I expect to live eternally but I think that would mess up the computation.)

Here's the bottom line. We can plan all we want but unless you are clairvoyant nothing will work out exactly as planned. The one sure bet we have concerning the future can be found in God's love expressed in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. No matter what, we will have God's love. God loves us so much that he sent his son to show us the way, to bring us healing, to even face and endure execution for our sake, and to show us that there is nothing sure about death.

May we all consider this in all the decisions we make that concern the future.
