An Encouraging Word from Pastor Mike

I'm currently getting our house in Sabillasville, Maryland ready for winter and for our eventual reoccupation. I'm discovering upon inspection that a great deal of work needs to be done. Before we
can live in the house again it will need some repairs to the roof and possibly the foundation. Some of
the windows will need weather stripping and some of the trim needs to be painted. Of course, the list
is a bit more extensive than what I've shared with you, but you get the gist. The whole point is to
make sure the structure can withstand the rigors of the coming winter and be a comfortable home for
us the rest of the year.

Homes require a great deal of maintenance; in fact, I've never heard of a maintenance-free home. I've also discovered that if I don't stay on top of the maintenance, it can get away from me and become much more work in the future. A minor roof leak can become a major problem over the course of a few months. A toilet that runs constantly can overwhelm a septic system and the electric bill. A broken gutter can flood a basement. Neglecting home maintenance buys a lot of trouble.

Paul writes in 1st Corinthian 6:19, "do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and *that* you are not your own?" (NASB) A temple is a structure meant to house or shelter that which is sacred or holy. According to Paul our lives can be considered the sacred dwelling places of God's Holy Spirit within us. Like any house, this house requires maintenance in order for it to remain firm against the rigors that assault our spirits, that could invade or compromise that which is sacred in all of us.

Paul uses another metaphor to describe preparing our lives to stand in the face of spiritual assault when he encourages us in Ephesians 6:10 – 18 to put on the whole Armor of God. "Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." The materials he suggests to shield us include investments in the truth, always endeavoring to do what is right, attending to the study and internalizing of scripture, strengthening our faith, and proclaiming the Gospel of peace.

So, as I attend to maintaining my physical home to withstand the rigors of winter, I also need to give some thought to how I am strengthening the temple that is my life which is a dwelling place of God's spirit within me. What can we do to strengthen our faith to withstand the challenges that seem all too prevalent these days? The answer is simple. We strengthen the foundations of our faith through reading and meditating on scripture. We fortify the walls through serving God in ministries of compassion and proclaiming God's love. We fortify the roof through prayer. By doing so we will be able to withstand anything this world throws at us!
