An Encouraging Word from Pastor Mike

"As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God?"

Psalm 41: 1 – 2a

There was a young man who approached a Christian hermit with this request; "show me how I can find God". "How great is this desire of yours?" asked the saintly man. "More than anything in the world", came the reply. The hermit took the young man to the shore of a lake, and they waded into the water until it was up to their necks. Then the holy man put his hand on the other's head and pushed him under the water. The young man struggled desperately, but the hermit did not release him until he was about to drown. When they returned to the shore, the saint asked, "Son, when you were under water, what did you desire more than anything in the world?" He replied without hesitation, "air!". "Well, then, when you desire to find God as much as you just then wanted air, your eyes will be opened to the wonder of God."

What are your greatest desires? What are the desires that give direction to our lives? Admittedly there are many desires that fill our lives. Many of them are trivial and some are less than worthy. Yet these desires direct our lives, and some may lead us to ruin. Nevertheless, desires are an important motivational force in the living of our lives. The Psalm that I quoted in the opening of this message declares what should be our greatest desire, the desire for God's presence in our lives.

Our lives are filled with many needs and desires. Our lives resemble a new house on moving day. Everything needed to make the house a comfortable home is present. The washer, dryer, range and dishwasher are present. The plumbing and heating are ready. The furniture has arrived and boxes of possessions are stacked everywhere. It's moving day chaos. Everything is present except there is no order. All that is needed is the owner to arrive and put everything in place, completing the home with their presence.

Our lives are filled with desires, needs, and priorities stacked here and there in a kind of chaos. But without the owner, God, occupying our heart, ordering and completing our desires, our lives will be incomplete. As we cultivate and pursue our desire for God, through attention to public worship, the reading of scripture, prayer, meditation and service our lives will come together. All unworthy and dangerous desires will be put away and our needs will be met. God will complete our lives in a way that all our other desires never will.

We all have many desires, worthy and unworthy, which are too many to name. I encourage you, no matter what your desires, to put the desire for God above them all. As you do, you will enjoy a level of living that the fulfillment of our other desires can never attain.
